When elected, Student Council members will serve as a representative for their classroom; give input on school and community projects, and work with various groups such as our Parent Teacher League (PTL), school administration, etc. Student Council members are asked to occasionally report to their classes, teachers, sponsors, etc. Each class will have two student council members as representatives. Members in grades 5-8 will have the opportunity to run for the offices of President, Vice-President, and Secretary. Student Council members, in collaboration with our teachers and staff, will be targeting many different manners and/or essentials that we feel are important to focus on as a Christian in today's world. Our hope is that this will help our students remember these "rules" and raise the standards on expected behavior in and out of the classroom, just as Jesus would have us do!

What can you expect from Student Council?

Expect to meet once a month for full Student Council Meetings (dates and times to be announced).
