**School Chapel donations** collected for Grace Lutheran School, St. Petersburg, Florida, were \$362.20. Donations collected at church for Grace Lutheran School are \$1,787.27 for total donations of \$2149.47. Thank you to everyone who donated.

**Third Quarter Chapel donations** for 3rd quarter will go to Hearts For Jesus. All contributions to Hearts for Jesus during the 24-25 school year will be used to help support Calvary Academy in Lusaka, Zambia, a ministry started by Emmanuel Mutale and his family with the Mission Statement: *To provide free education in their community for children whose parents have died from HIV/AIDS and cancer related issues.* Specifically, they provide meals, uniforms and school fees for children.

The new goal is to build a school of their own that would waive fees for vulnerable children, making education possible for those that otherwise would not have that opportunity.

The schools mission statement is: *Calvary Academy lives by faith, more like a setting where less privileged learners are being taken care of and they depend on God for feeding, accommodation and all other needs. Teachers and other members of staff live by faith, employment of staff and admission procedure is strictly based on faith belief. Calvary Academy faculty and staff focus on providing a safe, nurturing environment with a quality, Christ-Centered education for students from pre-school through Grade 7.*

We believe that God the Father created the world. We also believe that Jesus Christ is the true Son of God, and true man, is the world's Savior from sin, death, and the power of the evil one. He alone won Life for us by His perfect life, death, and resurrection from the dead.

### **Hurricane Helene Disaster Response**

The flooding from Hurricane Helene has cause devastation across several districts of the LCMS. Instead of sending any funds to the Nebraska District office, we ask that you give directly to one of the districts that are on the ground and offering assistance through Lutheran Early Response Team projects, local congregations, and Recognized Service Organizations.

**It's a blessing** to be able to watch the service online, on our website and You Tube. Offerings are used to help make this online service possible and to continue the work of the church and school. **"Joyful Response:** your offerings go directly from your bank account to our St. Paul Lutheran Church and School account. Please call the church office to set this up. Have your bank account number and routing number when you call. Your donations can be given weekly, monthly, or bi-monthly, and you will receive a giving statement.

**Each month, the Salvation Army and Food for the Heartland** provides non-perishable food items, bread, and vegetables/fruits for area residents. Volunteers from local churches distribute the food at the drive-through pickup held the third Saturday of each month. Any Cuming County resident can pick-up food; there are no income restrictions. Grace Lutheran Church has received several grants to add protein and dairy to the monthly distribution, and that money has supported this program for 2 years. Unfortunately, the funds are running low. Each month, anywhere from \$750 - \$800 is needed to pay for the protein and dairy items for the 70-80 households that receive food. We are asking for help in raising additional money to continue to provide protein/dairy monthly. Perhaps your business, church, club, family would like to sponsor a month, or two, or more.
